

Years ago, at the Rialto theatre in Jamaica, West Indies, Jeff saw his first movie, titled "One Potato, Two Potato." He admired the talent, class, and sophistication of the woman portraying that character, and turned to his mom and said, "That is what I want to do when I grow up, be an actor and be as good as that woman."

Years later, he auditioned and landed a role in "Play Mas" with the Urban Arts Corps. The role was a dancing witch doctor in a grass skirt, and he should be a West Indian who can sing, dance and act.



He has since done many movies for the screen, "Predator II" "Marked for Death," "Don't be a Menace," "Only the strong," to name a few and numerous guest spots for television, including lead roles in the series, "Hudson Street" for ABC and "Union Square" for NBC, prime-time shows and daytime soap operas, and other series lead roles for the major television networks.

A director of numerous productions on and off-Broadway. He recently directed and premiered in, "Speak of Me as I Am," the story of Paul Robeson with K. B. Solomon at the North Carolina Black Theatre Festival, to rave reviews.

Jeffrey was Associate Producer for and performed in the Black Star of The Great White Way" event at the prestigious Carnegie Hall in N.Y. in June of 2014. He is the founder and artistic director for the Caribbean American Repertory Theatre West, in Los Angeles. He sits on the boards of the National Black Theatre Festival in North Carolina, Hollywood Diversity Association and Splassher.com, winner of several NAACP theatre awards and a contract instructor for Theatre of Hearts/Youth First. His film, the musical, "Revival" was released in 2017. He is also a father, an activist and teacher of voice, articulation, and American Sign Language. He is currently, in pre-production for the Docudrama, "Justice Delayed" the account of a trial that Marcus Garvey won in Jamaica.



## **Shauna Chin**

Ms. Shauna Chin is the Vice Chair for the Global Jamaica Diaspora Council and the Representative of the USA West and Mid-West.

Shauna uses her skills as a US Army trained Nurse and her notoriety as an actress to augment her humanitarian efforts and raise awareness to various causes. Thus, affording her the unique circumstance of bringing not just one, but multiple areas of expertise to the Global Jamaica Diaspora Council in the key subject areas: citizen security, education, health and wellness, arts sports and culture, commerce and development issues.

She is a long-standing champion for diaspora matters, previously serving as Goodwill Ambassador for the National Association of Jamaican and Supportive Organizations (NAJASO) and is the current United Nations Association of Jamaica (UNAJ) Ambassador. For the period 2014-2018, she volunteered at the Consulate of Jamaica-Los Angeles where she implemented a successful immigration and deportation plan with the goal for every Jamaican national in her region to have: a valid government issued ID; an immigration and deportation plan and increased access to their nearest Consulate to ease doing business with Jamaica.







This year marked Jamaica Awareness Association's 23<sup>rd</sup> annual Medical and Education Mission to Jamaica. On behalf of the education Team, I would like to extend my thanks and gratitude to JAAC's members, leadership team and the many volunteers, who all worked tirelessly in planning and executing a successful mission.

The Education Team visited over 17 schools over a five-day period. We visited schools in the parishes of Portland, St. James, Trelawny. Hanover and Westmoreland. We were able to distribute almost 2,000 backpacks and school supplies directly to the students. #### 22<sup>nd</sup> ANNUAL MEDICAL MISSION 2023

A team of Physicians, Dentists, Nurse Practitioner, Dietitian, Pharmacist, Nurses, and Dental Students completed a medical mission the week of June 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023

This year our medical mission took us back to the parishes of St. Mary, St. Ann, Trelawny, and Mandeville. We added visits to Westmoreland, Hanover, Sav-La-Mar and Montego Bay. A laparoscopic tower was donated to Falmouth Public General Hospital to commence a laparoscopic surgery training program going forward.

JAAC was able to ship over 100 boxes of supplies. Boxes of supplies were either delivered or collected to Noel Holmes Hospital, Sav-La-Mar Hospital, Annotto Bay Hospital, Mandeville Hospital, and Falmouth Hospital. Shipment included a laparoscopic tower, surgical supplies & equipment as well as boxes of medication and supplies that were used in the hospitals, medical and dental clinics as follows:

**Granville Baptist Church**: Total of 77 patients: Dental 26, medical 55, children 11. CPR classes, attended by 15 participants.

**Brown's Town Baptist Church**: Total of 122 patients: Dental 56, medical 58, Children 10. Nurse visit 26, 5 triaged then left.

Spicy Hill Community Center: Total of 123 patients: Dental 56, medical 76, Children 23

Perfect Health Clinic: Total of 54 patients: Dental 43, medical 32

**Brown's Town Nursing College:** CPR Class with Certification for 26 Nursing Students.

Holiday Inn Resort: Total of 67 employees Dental 34 medical 62.

**Professional Eye Care Clinic**: Total 61 patients: Dental 30, medical 27, Children 4. Total of 50 students at Montego Bay High School participated in CPR class.

Jamaica Green Botanicals: Total of 111 patients: 72 Adults 39 Children. Dental 39, medical 72.

New Testament Church of God: Total of 156 patients: Dental 77, medical 79

**Good Shepherd Medical Center, Hope Teaching Health Clinic:** Total of 66 patients: Dental 29, medical 37.

Mt. Zion Primary and Infant School: 31 Students received medical and dental care.

Mt. Carey Baptist School: Total of 86 patients

**St. Mary Prep. School**: Total of 32 patients

Watford Hill Primary School: Total of 40 students.

**Mt. Salem School – 4 days:** 294 students and 19 adults received medical and dental care. 53 extractions performed.

Throughout the week, diagnoses included, but were not limited to, hypertension, diabetes, skin disorders, asthma, dental ailments, GYN related ailments, HIV, aches and pains. Medication and education were given as appropriate. Copies of intake sheets were left with the staff at each center for follow-up or given to patients seen at community centers with instructions to take to their personal physicians. All patients were encouraged to return to their personal physicians for follow-up. Approximately 50 patients were given blood pressure machines with instruction to monitor their pressure.

All follow-ups, and after care are provided by the SMO and medical team of each hospital.



# History Made at Falmouth Hospital

US-based JAAC performs first laparoscopic surgery after donating US\$300,000 in equipment

# FALMOUTH, Trelawny — Doctors have performed a historic laparoscopic surgery at Falmouth Public General Hospital here.



It occurred last Thursday, days after the US-based Jamaican Awareness Association of California (JAAC) handed over equipment valued at US\$300,000 (around \$45 million) to the medical institution to establish laparoscopy services there.

The doctors are all members of JAAC.

On Friday there was a mood of euphoria among stakeholders, including Senior Medical Officer (SMO) Dr Leighton Perrins who could not contain his joy regarding the establishment of laparoscopy services at the Type B facility, which resulted in the historical surgery.

"This is a historical moment. It is the first laparoscopic surgery done at the Falmouth Public General Hospital," Dr Perrins expressed.

The laparoscopic procedure was used to remove a gall bladder from patient Marcia Johnson. If the jubilant mood in which the patient was captured on Friday, a day after the historical surgery, is anything to go by then the procedure may be deemed successful.

Performing procedures the laparoscopic way, Dr Perrins argued, allows for less risk of infections and wound complications — and patients spend reduced periods in hospitals.

"It [laparoscopic surgery] shortens hospital stay; they [patients] eat quicker; they are back to baseline. She [Johnson] is up and about walking. A surgery like this done in a private setting would cost between \$1.5 million and \$2 million," the SMO said.

St Andrade Sinclair, director of the Western Regional Health Authority (WRHA), was also elated over the advent of laparoscopic services being offered at Falmouth.

"I welcome it, look forward to it, and hope that we can capitalise on this moment because we can not only get rid of our backlog, but it will be less stress — both on our staff and our purse and everything. It gets people back to work quick, quick, quick, and it cut back on major surgery because this is now minimally invasive," Sinclair said.

Over the years JAAC's medical team has left its mark at other medical institutions, among them Annotto Bay, Savanna-la-Mar, Mandeville, Victoria Jubilee, Princess Margaret, May Pen, and Kingston Public hospitals.

The charity organisation's President Patrick Williams told reporters that Thursday's surgery by JAAC doctors also doubled as training for local doctors.
