As a representative of the Executive Board and esteemed Membership of the Jamaica Awareness Association of California (JAAC), we gather to celebrate, support, and advance the inspiring work of JAAC, strengthening communities in Los Angeles and Jamaica. This evening is a joyous occasion to connect, reflect, and embrace the spirit of giving.

We honor the unity and excellence that fuels our organization. For over 37 years, JAAC has remained committed to "Improving Lives Today for a Better Tomorrow." Tonight, we recognize the unwavering dedication of our founding members, past members, and the future leaders who all share this vision. Here is a glimpse of some of JAAC's highlights & remarkable work this past year:

Local Projects: We continued to make a difference, impacting many lives in Los Angeles in partnership with

various local groups. These include the Los Angeles Family Housing and various churches Food Banks. We are most humbled to have had the opportunity to collaborate with the Downtown Los Angeles Women's Center on Skid Row. During our visits we prepared and served hot nutritious meals for about 200 homeless women, offering comfort and dignity to those in need.

Annual Mission: Our 24th mission to Jamaica engaged over 80 volunteers, including doctors, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, educators, and general support teams, who served communities across the parishes of Mandeville, St. Elizabeth, Westmoreland, Hanover, St. James, Trelawny and Portland.

Medical: This year's mission provided care to more than 1,600 patients and dispensed medications valued at over \$15,000. They also dispensed 100 blood pressure and 200 glucose monitors to patients at each clinic. Essential medical supplies and equipment were also donated to support hospitals, clinics, and infirmaries in critical need.

Dental: This year, our Dental Team, in addition to routine examinations and extractions, offered dental cleaning for the first time to over 600 patients. Our Pediatric Dental team visited seven primary schools, serving over 380 students with dental cleanings, extractions, fillings, and sealants.

Surgical Team: During the mission week, our surgical team collaborated with local hospital staff to complete 18 vital laparoscopic procedures. Our team offered quality care, collaborating with Jamaican surgical teams to bring hope and healing to underserved communities.

Educational Support: JAAC donated over 2,000 backpacks with school supplies, along with 24 computers, 200 tablets, 36 laptops, 10 PA systems, 40 projectors, 20 smart TV monitors, and 8 printers to students and schools across Jamaica. We also awarded 4 - 5 years' academic scholarships and one one-year academic scholarship to students starting their high school careers. These were at a value of \$55,000.00.

I would like to commend the team members of the National Healthcare Enhancement Foundation Limited and the Health Promotion & Education Dept., within the Ministry of Health, National Education Trust within the Ministry of Education, and Jamaica Customs. Their dedication and partnership have been invaluable in helping us expand our reach and impact, ensuring effective service delivery for the communities we serve.

This dedication led to the tremendous success of our 24th Annual Mission Trip, with services and equipment disbursed valued at an estimated USD 650,000. All of this would not be possible without our dedicated volunteers and your financial support.

Tonight, we proudly recognize Hermin Hussen, recipient of the President's Award, and Marcia McBean, recipient of the Community Service Award, for their outstanding contributions to JAAC. I also extend heartfelt thanks to Lisa Hayles and Jacqueline Williams for their vital roles by providing well needed support and coordination for JAAC on the ground in Jamaica, sustaining our outreach programs.

An organization like JAAC thrives because of the generosity of people like you. Proceeds from tonight's event will help fund our 2025 medical and education mission to Jamaica and support our local outreach in Los Angeles. Your presence here tonight makes a powerful statement, and we invite you to continue this journey with us as a scholarship donor, sponsor, member, or mission volunteer.

As we celebrate, let us embrace the spirit of excellence and unity that drives JAAC forward. Together, we are "Improving Lives Today for a Better Tomorrow!"



Dr. Wiggan is a proud alumnus of Northern Caribbean University in Jamaica and La Sierra University in Riverside, California. His greatest intellectual treasures are found in the pages of books, reflecting his belief that "learning never ends." This dedication to continuous learning underscores his commitment to personal and professional growth. A strong advocate for financial literacy, social development, and economic stability, Dr. Wiggan actively works to empower individuals and communities through education. She is a long-standing champion for diaspora matters, previously serving as Goodwill Ambassador for the National Association of Jamaican and Supportive Organizations (NAJASO) and is the current United Nations Association of Jamaica (UNAJ) Ambassador. For the period 2014-2018, she volunteered at the Consulate of Jamaica-Los Angeles where she implemented a successful immigration and deportation plan with the goal for every Jamaican national in her region to have: a valid government-issued ID; an immigration and deportation plan and increased access to their nearest Consulate to ease doing business with Jamaica. In 2024, Dr. Chin was appointed as the Honorary Consul Designate for Jamaica to Los Angeles and is pending accreditation.

2024 PRESIDENT'S AWARD JAAC Hermin Hussen



As a final-year student at Catherine Hall Primary, he earned a place at Cornwall College through the Grade Six Achievement Test (GSAT). With JAAC's support, Dr. Stewart was able to focus on his studies in the natural sciences at Cornwall College, with the scholarship fund covering his educational expenses, easing financial burdens, and allowing him to pursue his dreams.

SURGICAL REPORT



During the 2024 JAAC medical mission, our surgical team collaborated with local surgical staff to complete 18 operative procedures at 2 hospitals. Our surgical team worked tirelessly to help a select group of patients identified by our local partners to be the highest priority for intervention. The operative procedures included laparoscopic cholecystectomies, hernia repairs, and a twin delivery by cesarean section.

Challenges such as power outages, and supply chain issues with equipment, were overcome by working collaboratively, thinking out of the box to successfully complete the planned procedures. This outreach was impactful with respect to supporting the local surgical teams in providing state of the art care to an underserved population.

We are grateful for the opportunity to help serve these communities and look forward to ongoing collaboration to further this effort.

Medícal and Dental Míssíon Report

From June 10 to June 14, 2024, a multidisciplinary team of Physicians, Dentists, Nurse Practitioners, a Dietitian, a Pharmacist, Nurses, and Dental Students successfully completed a medical mission across six parishes in Jamaica. The mission, organized by the Jamaica Awareness Association of California (JAAC), focused on providing critical medical and dental care to underserved communities in **St. Elizabeth**, **Trelawny, Mandeville, St. James, Westmoreland, and Hanover.**

Over 100 boxes of medical supplies and equipment were shipped to support the mission, distributed to hospitals and infirmaries throughout the region.

Medical and Dental Services Overview

The mission provided essential medical, dental, and optical services at various clinics. Four teams were deployed across the parishes:

Team 1 served 561 patients across Trelawny, Westmoreland, Hanover, St. James, and St. Elizabeth. Team 2 treated 565 patients in St. James, Westmoreland, Hanover, and St. Elizabeth. Team 3 focused on school-based clinics, treating 178 students. Team 4 supported additional school clinics, providing vital services to students at various primary schools.

Diagnoses and Follow-Up

Common conditions treated included hypertension, diabetes, asthma, skin disorders, dental issues, and gastrointestinal problems. Medications and educational materials were provided, and over 80 patients received blood pressure monitors with instructions for self-management. Patients were encouraged to follow up with their personal physicians, with intake sheets left at local clinics to support ongoing care.

Conclusion

The 2024 JAAC medical mission made a significant impact, reaching hundreds of patients across six parishes. Through the collaborative efforts of medical professionals, volunteers, and local institutions, the mission improved access to essential healthcare for underserved populations. We look forward to continuing these efforts in the years to come.

This year, the education team made visits to 17 schools across the parishes of Portland, St. James, St. Elizabeth, Hanover and Westmoreland. During these visits, they donated nearly 2,000 backpacks filled with school supplies, along with essential education tools such as desktop computers, laptops, PA systems, tablets, microphones, projectors, printers and library books. Additionally, the team provided sensory aides specifically designed to support children with special needs, ensuring every student has the resource to thrive.

JAAC also continued to expand its scholarship program, awarding five new scholarships to deserving students. Congratulations to our 2024 scholarship recipients: Aldane Salmon, Jehshawn Williams, Enyameika Daley, Jaydan Edwards and Sueanna Dwyer. We look forward to seeing the bright futures they will create.


